MUCC Updates*

School is out, folks are planning their summer vacations, the boat is in the water and you're eyeing that next fishing adventure — there is no better place to live than Michigan. The big mayflies of June are starting to come off and trout are taking notice. Walleye are moving into the deeper water. It's amazing that we are able to catch trout, bass, pike, panfish, walleye, sturgeon, musky, and many other fish species, all within a few hour's drive.

Legislative Updates:

On June 8, the Michigan Senate passed stakeholder-led commercial guiding legislation on a bipartisan vote. The bill package now moves to the House and has been assigned to the House Natural Resources, Environment, Tourism, and Outdoor Recreation Committee.

Natural Resources Commission (NRC)

The NRC voted on several deer regulation proposals at June's meeting. No season dates were changed at this time. Commissioners passed Wildlife Conservation Order #5 of 2023, allowing off-lead tracking dogs to recover legally shot game species. This order had been tabled for months as commissioners and the DNR worked on the final language. MUCC supports the use of off-lead tracking by qualified trackers. While this order is a step in the right direction per our grassroots policy, we would support a training requirement for dog and tracker and the CPL requirement.

Conservation Policy Board (CPB)

MUCC held its first Conservation Policy Board meeting of 2023 up in Big Bay at the historic Thunder Bay Inn. There are many ways for conservationists to help improve wildlife habitat in Michigan through our "On the Ground" program this summer.

A couple of weekends ago, volunteers joined MUCC on public land in Newberry to plant nearly 90 mast-producing trees in an effort to improve habitat for a variety of wildlife. We're now looking for volunteers for our upcoming summer projects! Below is one such project happening in July.
