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Archery is Open April 2

It is April and that means the complete archery 3D course is OPEN! The full set of 30 targets, plus a bonus, were dutifully installed by volunteers in March and bow holders have been upgraded and or repaired so as to make it easy to keep your bow out of the dirt. If you should happen to see any of the volunteers who made it happen, give them a shout. See page 3 for a few pics.

The regular **Tuesday evening shoots**, which are open to the public, will start on **April 2** and last through the end of September, every Tuesday, beginning at 5:30. Any archer, beginner or experienced, member or not, is welcome to walk the mile course, launching arrows at a wide variety of foam animal targets from varying distances, with or without a scorecard. The April setup includes numerous turkey targets, especially for those spring gobbler hunters. Deer, bear, and hog targets are the norm but several varieties of African game are also on the course. And Bullwinkle is still awaiting at station 24.

Member self-serve is still open seven days a week. Please remember to put your \$5 in the mailbox on the archery shed door. Non-members are \$10 and youth, ages 8-17 are \$5. Under 8, free.

The 50-yard bag target range is still open to all members at no charge. This is a great place to double check your site pins. Bag targets are also sufficient for cross bow practice.

Our Club will once again be offering Hunter Education Field Days. These will not be Traditional Courses. You will first have to complete either the DNR's Online Course or the Home Study Course. **THERE IS NO COST FOR THE FIELD DAY.**

- 1. <u>THE ONLINE COURSE:</u> It can be found at https://www.hunter-ed.com You then need to log on, register, pay their \$29.95 fee, complete the course and pass their test, print off your "Field Day Voucher". Then "sign up" to take one of our inperson Field Days in order to get your Hunter Certificate to purchase your hunting license. YOU MUST BRING THIS VOUCHER TO THE FIELD DAY!
- 2. THE HOME STUDY COURSE: To register for this course, you need to log into https://michgan.storefront.kalkomey.com/em/programs and set up your account. Then go down to "Hunter Education Field Day" and search for our Club's field days. In the course description on the DNR website there are instructions on what days you can come to the St. Joe County Conservation & Sportsman Club to pick up your "Student Manual". ALL THE TEST QUESTIONS IN THE BACK OF THE MANUAL MUST BE COMPLETED AND BROUGHT TO THE FIELD DAY! This is your entry into the Field Day and proves you did the class.
