Reminder for Range Safety Briefing!

Due to the safety issues the club has experienced on the Rifle and Pistol ranges, many with resultant property damage, the Board of Directors has implemented a <u>mandatory</u> Range Safety training for ALL MEMBERS, REGARDLESS OF YOUR ACTIVITY OF CHOICE. **ALL existing members/** member households will need to attend one of these sessions to renew their membership after December 2026. Unfortunately, only a small percentage of existing members has attended to date. Sign up now!

"Lost in the Hills" 3D Archery Shoot 7/19

On July 19th the club will again host the Lost in the Hills 3D archery tournament with plenty of fun, prizes, and challenges. For those not familiar with 3D archery, the premise is to simulate hunting scenarios by placing foam 3D animal targets in a wooded setting and at varied distances. The targets have marked scoring rings which award more points for arrows in the vital area of the animal. Starts at 8am, ending by 3pm. Must start by noon.

The Lost in the Hills course includes 30 targets over a mile long walk and will also feature novelty targets such as "cut the string" and "the flying pig". Last year's most popular target was the "side-by-side" deer. Compound bows and traditional bows are all welcome. Prizes will be awarded to the top three shooters in adult men compound, adult women compound, adult traditional, youth compound, and youth traditional classes. Door prizes will be awarded and the *first 50 entries receive a free t-shirt*. The cost of Lost in the Hills is \$20 for adults and \$15 for youth. Editor's note: However, we can report that there was an incident on the Cowboy range that resolved safely and successfully due to proper safety and first aid training of our staff and participants. Remember, firearm safety training is so very important in our shooting sports: all of them. But even with proper training in the handling of firearms, equipment and ammo issues can still occur. It is paramount to know and understand the safety rules that apply to our sport and first aid training.

As a reminder, we must always follow the 4 basic firearm handling rules:

- Always keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction
- Always keep your finger off the trigger until ready to shoot
- Always keep the action unloaded and open until ready to shoot
- Know your target and what is beyond
