"Don't Be THAT Guy!"

Damage, Unsafe Behavior on Rifle and Pistol Ranges Andy Rockwell – Lower Range Director – Cell Phone: 260-668-9317

"YOU RUINED IT FOR EVERYONE!" From the McDonald's coffee lawsuit lady to the airplane "Shoe Bomber", to the guy who invented E-85 Gasoline, there are plenty of examples of people who screwed up, and now the rest of us have to deal with the fall-out. These people brought us ridiculous warning labels on products, taking our shoes off at airport security, and terrible gas mileage....and now: the potential for cameras, more gates, expenses, and rules at our club. Don't be "THAT guy"! Unfortunately, it appears we may have a few of "THAT guy" among us.

<u>Keep your muzzle pointed in a safe direction.</u> On our rifle/ pistol ranges, the "safe direction" is down-range (toward the target frames) and below the tops of the dirt berms. "up", "left", and "right" are **NOT** safe directions for the muzzle. Regardless of what you have been told before or seen on TV or YouTube: <u>"UP" IS NOT A SAFE DIRECTION!</u>





Keep your finger off the trigger - <u>AND</u> <u>OUTSIDE OF THE TRIGGER GUARD!</u> - until your

sights are on the target. If your finger is still inside the trigger guard, even if it's not touching the trigger, there is potential for your hand to flinch or the rifle to slip, causing an unintentional discharge.



"THAT guy" ignored these rules, and as a result we have some new bullet holes in our roof and wall. That brings us to eight (8) bullet holes in our buildings that I know of. We got lucky no one was hurt!

Further, when using the windows in the heated areas of the rifle range, it is very important to <u>GET YOUR MUZZLE BEYOND THE</u> <u>WINDOW!</u> If you have a short barrel rifle, or can't comfortably reach beyond the window, you may have to move a table and use the windowsill itself as your "bench" or open one of the roll-up doors. The 60,000 PSI sideways blast from your muzzle brake causes substantial damage to the window frames!





The only approved targets at our club are paper or cardboard, or steel "gong" type targets. No spinners, balloons, bowling pins, tin cans, Tannerite, etc. These things create a huge mess that someone must clean up. But worse yet, they create unpredictable ricochets, and bullets can travel for miles! Are you "THAT guy" who brought a chain-saw and leaf blower to shoot to pieces on our ranges and left the mess? **THIS IS NEVER OK!**

Look folks, we have 1,000 member households at this club. I realize I'm scolding the whole membership to get my point across to the few. I also understand that accidents happen. Call me or any Board Member, we'll address it and move on. My hope is that all 1,000 of us will help keep an eye out and will stop and report dangerous behavior. We are all owners. We are all "Range Safety Officers"! So far, we've only suffered property damage. It's annoying and expensive, but we can fix it. The reality is **THIS UNSAFE BEHAVIOR CAN KILL SOMEONE!** Don't be "THAT guy"!

We ask that if you see anything unusual, such as inappropriate, unsafe, illegal, or other actions that are against our range rules, to **please contact one of the club officers, the specific range manager, or another board member** (*page 3*) to report what you have seen.

If you feel comfortable speaking with an individual when you witness something they are doing that is against the club range rules, you may do so in a calm nonconfrontational way, but you do not have to if you are uncomfortable doing so, or especially if you are concerned for your own safety. However, please always contact a club board member to report what you have witnessed. *Stay safe!*
